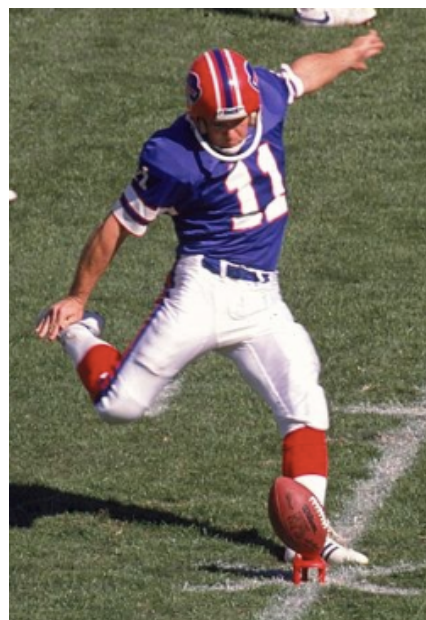

What is a "Columbarium"?

Webster's dictionary defines it as "A vault for the dead with niches for cinerary urns".

Our church has a Columbarium on the east side of the church building. A brick path begins at the patio outside of the Yellow Room and ends at the Columbarium. Its purpose is to provide for hallowed resting place for the church family members who wish to be cremated. It also has benches and is a quiet place to meditate or to sit and remember our loved ones.

Inurnment is open to past and present members of the church, their spouses, parents, grandparents, children, and grandchildren. Only the ashes of one body will be inurned in a niche. No pets shall be buried in the garden.

Our Coumbarium currently has 96 niches, 60 of which have already been purchased by our church family members. More niches will be prepared as needed. The cost is \$500 for one niche and \$950 for two niches. This covers the cost of opening and sealing of the niche, identification, and maintenance of the area. As you make plans for your family's future needs, the Columbarium is an option to be considered. For more information, please call Mary Lou Forster at 592-4897.

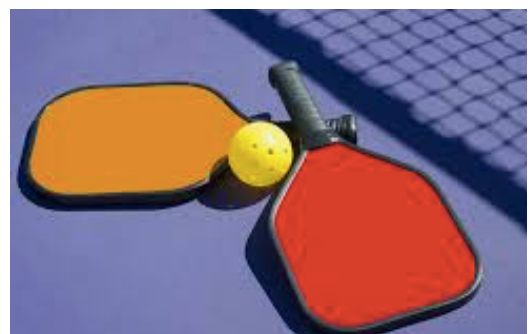

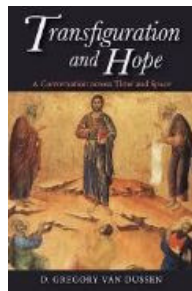

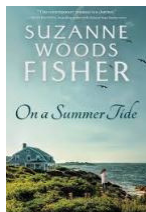
Transfiguration and Hope: A Conversation across Time and Space by D. Gregory Van Dussen

To read and visualize the transfiguration of Christ is to enter its mystery and encounter its hope. Like the Gospel writers and the disciples who climbed the mountain with Jesus, we struggle to tell the story and explain its meaning. Yet this astounding event reveals God's ultimate purpose in sending his Son--the complete restoration of humanity and all creation--our transfiguration in Christ. The light and glory of that moment reveal a destiny that is infinite and eternal, made possible by the power of grace. Transfiguration is the trajectory and goal of our spiritual journey. Across time and space, Christians have reflected on the mystery and hope epitomized in the transfiguration, yet their voices have been heard primarily within their own cultural and ecclesiastical contexts. This study gathers many of those voices from the panorama of Scripture and church history and finds in them the common theme of radical transformation in Christ. The point of this theological conversation is spiritual transfiguration and hope for each of us as we reach toward the future Christ has shown us in himself.

FICTION BOOKS OF THE MONTH

Many Sparrows by Lori Benton

Fiction with a great spiritual message that will challenge each reader to be still, wait and let God fight their battle for them. In the year 1774 in the Ohio Kentucky frontier, the Colonists begin taking over the Native American territories. Philip must leave his pregnant wife Clare and their four-year old son Jacob, alone on a mountain trail. The Shawnee Indians take Jacob and hold him captive. Philip does not return and Clare must find the best way possible to get her son back. "Stunning...an inspired masterpiece sure to stir the soul."

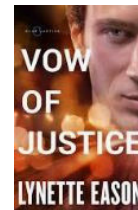


On a Summer Tide by Suzanne Woods Fisher book #1 in the Three Sisters Islands Series

Sometimes love hurts--and sometimes it can heal in the most unexpected way. Camden Grayson loves her challenging career, but the rest of her life could use some improvement. "Moving on" is Cam's mantra. But there's a difference, her two sisters insist, between one who moves on and one who keeps moving. Cam's full-throttle life skids to a stop when her father buys a remote island off the coast of Maine. Paul Grayson has a dream to breathe new life into the island--a dream that includes reuniting his estranged daughters. Certain Dad has lost his mind, the three sisters rush to the island. To Cam's surprise, the slow pace of island life appeals to her, along with the locals--and one in particular. Seth Walker, the scruffy island schoolteacher harbors more than a few surprises.

A Song of Joy by Lauraine Snelling is book #4 in the Under Northern Skies Series

In Minnesota in 1911, Nilda Carlson is torn between life in the city of Blackduck and spending time with her family back home on the farm. Her employer, Mrs. Schoenleber, gives her more and more responsibility, including leading an exciting new project to help the community's immigrants. Nilda tries to focus on raising money to build affordable homes for Blackduck's newcomers, but a probate detective in town keeps stirring up trouble. Nilda finds herself being distracted by her piano teacher, Fritz Larsson, and she looks



forward to his increasingly frequent visits to Blackduck. The more she learns about him, the more she falls for him. Except the man who wants to court her is not Fitz, but a man from Minneapolis whose wealthy background feels like a foreign world to her. Nilda must decide what the future holds for her.

Vow of Justice by Lynette Eason is #4 in the Blue Justice Series

FBI Special Agent Lincoln St. John is living his own personal nightmare. When the woman he loves, Allison Radcliffe, is killed, he devotes his life to tracking down the killers and making them pay for their crimes. He expected it to be a challenge. What he never expected was to find Allison very much alive shortly after her "murder." As his anger and hurt mix with relief, Linc isn't sure how he's supposed to feel. One thing he does know for sure: he and Allison will have to work together to stop a killer before she dies a second time--this time for good.

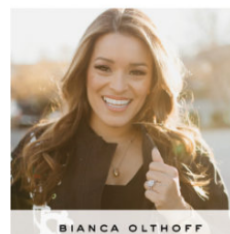

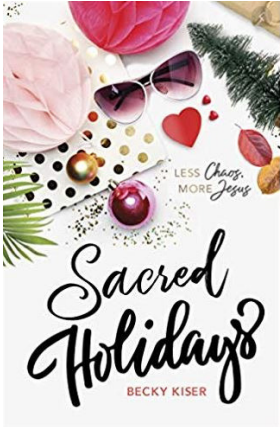
