From The Pastor's Desk

Growing Together

I have some exciting news for myself and SIUMC. I have been accepted into Northeastern Seminary's Doctor of Ministry Program. This doctorate level degree is different than most others. Instead of going away to school, the Doctor of Ministry (D. Min) is considered a "practical degree". One of the unique things about such programs is that you do it while in the context of the ministry setting you are in. So for us, that means I continue to be your pastor and the work I do for class is meant to build up the ministry we share together.

How will this help our church? First, I think it is important to be clear about why this program is something I need to pursue now. I am approximately half way through my ministry career, I have two decades under my belt and two more left. Ministry and the world around the church has changed dramatically since I started as a pastor. The United Methodist Church requires pastors to do continuing education each year, and I have felt the need to spend some time digging deep to best help the church adjust to the changes we already have experienced and to be ready for what is ahead. My hope and expectation is that we will be experiencing this future together. The top-notch training I will get at Northeastern will help us ask the right questions and provide guidance on our next steps. Doctor of Ministry programs are only open to people who have been in ministry for a while. So I will also be learning along-side other experienced pastors who are dealing with similar things that our church has or will be wrestling with. Being in this environment will give me the support and tools to walk with you in the call God is giving us for the coming years.

Pursuing this work is something that I have considered for a long time. Yet, engaging in the work this year came about rather quickly. Northeastern is the seminary that is linked with Roberts Wesleyan College in Rochester. They are approved by the UMC as a place for pastors to be trained and when I spoke with them at the Annual Conference, I found out that I was eligible for a large grant if I started this fall. In addition to the cost savings, being in Rochester will help for the two weeks in January and June that I will need to be on campus over the next couple of years.

This is a big commitment, it will take me approximately I5 hours a week over the next few years to complete my studies. I look forward to seeing how this work will help us step into a faithful future together as we approach the work of growing in Christ and making new disciples.


Propel Conversation

Then the yellow room is reserved for their regular meeting on October 19th 9:00 a.m. – 12:00.


Al-Anon/AA

Pickle Ball is available on Monday and Thursday evenings from 6:00 – 8:00 in the Family Life Center. See the information near the church office where you will find a contact number.




Library Corner
